Principals Report – Stephanie Labby

- 1) Teacher Vacancies
- a) There are 3 divisions that have vacancies (2 in Grade 7 and 1 in Grade 8)
- b) At this time, we are working with human resources to hire a teacher for these classes.

- c) We can assure families that we have supports in place as we go through the hiring process. The children will excellent educational programming with the support of our instructional services district teachers who are working alongside this class. In addition, we are fortunate to have wonderful teaming teachers in our building who are supporting these classes.
- 2) National Day of Truth and Reconciliation
- a) National Truth for Reconciliation Day takes place on September 30th. In honor of the lost children and survivors of residential schools, their families and communities, we will have an assembly on September 27th in second block.
- b) There is no school on September 30th.
- 3) Middle read aloud (Barren Grounds)
- a) The middle read aloud provides the opportunity for the entire school to connect.
- b) The entire school is reading the book and completing related activities.
- c) Creates connections, belonging and unites the school and the middle schools in the district.
- d) Benefits of the read aloud: it provides adult model of fluent reading (voice, tone, volume, inflection, pace, gesture). Develops a sense of story/text. Develops vocabulary. Encourages prediction/connections. Builds a community of readers. Develops active listening. Teaches the reading process in a meaningful context. Motivates students to read. Treasurer Report

2024/25 Budget notes:

-we did our best to create a budget with the information passed on to us and receipts from last year, amounts are estimates. Next year's budget will be more precise when we have a year of exact amounts to base it on.

-the format of the budget is different than in previous years, it now shows total income, expenses, and profit. A loss, indicated as a number in brackets at the bottom, reflects surplus money that we have budgeted to spend. -The general fund budget is our main account used for most fundraising and expenses such as class allowances which make up the majority of our yearly spending.

-The Gaming budget is grant money we receive from the government, this can only be spent on a specific list of things unrelated to the curriculum, and each year's grant must be spent within 3 years or paid back. This year we have kept the majority of these funds set aside for field trip support, this can be spent on buses or subsidizing the cost of field trips at the teacher's discretion. We may adjust this once we have a better idea of what these funds are being used for at the end of this school year.

-budget will be updated throughout the year for each PAC meeting

Other 2024/25 updates:

-we have budgeted \$200 each for classroom enhancements for each division and expos in addition to \$200 each for ELL and Resource. Staff will need to complete a cheque request form and attach original receipts for reimbursement, this is important for our financial records.
